About the tool

What is Exile Flow?

Exile Flow is a powerful Al-driven intelligence-mining tool that accelerates and enhances project opportunity discovery. It taps into hidden intelligence and extracts fresh insights from the news, data and conversations shaping project, export, trade and development finance.



How will Exile Flow help me?

Exile Flow will dramatically **reduce the time** it takes to find the information you need from Proximo, TXF and Uxolo by allowing you to directly ask the questions you need answered.

It will provide you with previously disconnected and unavailable information by searching across the whole Exile database at once, making it more likely that you will unearth new opportunities and insights.

It can also draw on the wider web to give you confidence that you are **not missing out on any available information** in your area of research.

How does it actually work?

Very much like any other modern Al tool, you interact with it by asking questions or giving commands: i.e., prompts. The Al responds to your prompts, fetching the relevant content and organising it in the way you ask it to.

You can refine the content, or change the way it is presented by giving further prompts. See 'How do I use it? for more information.

What are Exile Flow's key features?

Chat format: Exile Flow works in a very similar way to commonly-used AI tools like ChatGPT or Gemini, making it intuitive to use.

Comprehensiveness: Exile Flow gives access to all Exile's content from across TXF, Proximo, Uxolo, including news, data sets, reports and conferences, to reassure you that you aren't missing anything.

Flexible outputs: Exile Flow can produce many different types of outputs such as text, tables and graphs and export the information in several common formats (Excel, jpg, pdf) so you get the information in the way that works best for you.



How is it different from ChatGPT and similar tools?

Unlike ChatGPT, Exile Flow's underlying technology is not a single large language model (LLM). Instead, it uses a combination of LLMs, augmented with a unique set of tools developed by the Exile development team.

These tools enable LLMs to access Exile's proprietary data, which is stored in several places, including articles, our deals database, and content from our events, such as video recordings of event sessions.

When you give Exile Flow a prompt, it will use the right LLM or combination of LLMs to ensure the best possible information is delivered.

What does this mean for me?

Exile Flow is more likely than ChatGPT or similar tools to deliver information that meets your expectations, because:

- 1) it is able to search lots of different types of information at once, and;
- 2) because it is drawing primarily on Exile content, which you already know to be highly relevant to your work.

How 'finished' is Exile Flow? Is it a beta product?

It is early days for Exile Flow. This is the first iteration of the tool, and we are seeking feedback from Exile customers and other interested parties on its usefulness and usability.

We do consider it a 'beta' product and expect users to discover bugs, usability issues, and areas for improvement. We are very keen to hear about these so we can address them. Contact us at ai@exilegroup.com.

How will it develop in the future?

Exile Flow will slowly be integrated into the Exile platform. How we do this will be determined in part by feedback from users in its beta phase.



Security

Is Exile Flow safe to use?

Yes. We follow industry-leading security standards, have built Exile Flow using trustworthy technologies, and ensure that all data is managed in accordance with relevant regulations.

Data Privacy and Confidentiality

It is paramount to keep your data confidential and secure. Your data is not used for purposes beyond your designated use cases. We use enterprise-level encryption models, which means that your data can't be observed or analysed by anyone. All of your inputs to and outputs from Exile Flow remain confidential and are not incorporated into LLMs' training datasets, or indeed shared with any third party.

Advanced Data Encryption

To safeguard your data from unauthorised access, we use robust encryption protocols. Data is encrypted both during transmission and storage, providing complete security throughout its lifecycle.

Where does Exile Flow get its information?

Exile Flow uses proprietary data from the Dealmakers' database, articles from Proximo, Uxolo, and TXF websites, and session content from our own virtual events platform. Additionally, it has access to the Bing search engine and therefore the wider web.

How accurate are the outputs?

Ensuring accurate outputs from Exile Flow is a high priority for us. This is achieved in part by the ongoing integration of the latest language models into the tool. By deploying the newest AI technology, Exile Flow



should get better and better at delivering outputs that are both precise and contextually relevant.

To maintain high levels of accuracy, we also use rigorous validation protocols. We frequently and thoroughly test the outputs generated by the tool.

We also make frequent updates to Exile Flow, based on user feedback and usage data, and our own ongoing testing, to ensure Exile Flow continues to develop in line with our customers' needs.

What should I do as a user?

While we strive for high levels of accuracy, it's important to acknowledge that no system is infallible. Occasional discrepancies may occur due to the inherent complexities of language and the dynamic nature of information. To mitigate inaccuracies, please verify any critical information provided by Exile Flow, and provide feedback to us on any inconsistencies encountered at ai@exilegroup.com.

This collaborative effort between the Exile Flow team and its users ensures continuous improvement, enhancing the reliability and effectiveness of the tool over time.

Usability

How do I use it?

This first version of Exile Flow works like other commonly-used AI tools, such as ChatGPT. You enter commands or questions - known as prompts - via a chat window, to get the information you need.

Careful prompting is very important to get the desired results. It is important to supply enough information in the prompt so Exile Flow has the right parameters to start its search. The prompt should contain the following 4 items:

	Item	Examples

1	A question or command that specifies the primary information required	 'What are the strengths / weaknesses of' 'What activity has there been in' 'What has company [X] recently done in the [X] area?'
2	Filters, to restrict the search	 Timeframe, e.g., 'since 1 January 2024' or 'over the past three months' Areas of finance, e.g., 'in commodities' or 'in export finance' Regions / countries, e.g., 'in northern Europe' or 'in Japan' Industries / subindustries: e.g., 'in mining' or 'in lithium mining'
3	Output format, to define what is expected	E.g., 'Give me a' • 'Detailed summary' • 'Table, with X in column A and Y in column B' • 'Pie chart' • 'Presentation'
4	Sources, to narrow the output	E.g., 'Use information from • 'The news only' • 'Deal data only' • 'Project data only' • 'TXF only' • 'TXF or Proximo' • 'Any source'

What do people typically use it for?

Exile Flow is an excellent starting point via which to research any area of interest covered by Proximo, TXF or Uxolo. You can explore a region or an industry, a competitor, a counterpart, a client or a prospect.

Consider use-cases such as:



- Finding new people to meet at an Exile event
- Researching the activity of a competitor
- Doing a background check on a potential client
- Checking your own position in the market
- Familiarising yourself with a new area of the market (e.g., a region, a sector)

Can I customise Exile Flow to my needs?

You can ask Exile Flow to present things in the specific way you need. See 'How do I use it?' above.

You can also provide information to Exile Flow and use the tool to analyse it on its own or combine it with Exile's own information. You can:

- Copy your text / data directly to Exile Flow or
- Paste a link to your information, e.g., to a PDF or webpage, and ask Exile

...and then ask it to search across that as well as all the other information sources the tool can access. Rest assured, any information you share won't be saved by the tool and therefore it won't be shared with anyone.

What types of outputs does Exile Flow create?

Exile Flow can produce many different types of outputs such as text, tables and graphs and export the information in several common formats (Excel, jpg, pdf) so you get the information in the way that works best for you.

What are its limitations?

The limitations are dictated by the information that Exile Flow has access to. It is not able to create content if the information is not there in the first place.

In addition, Exile Flow is a 'beta' product and we expect users to discover bugs, usability issues, and areas for improvement. We are very
